






I like paper.



<u>Foundations</u>: writing tools, sorting, colors, letters, numbers, shapes, letter sounds (see phonics above), patterns (number, format, size, item) - make sure to look closely, there are many!

<u>Inquiry</u>: What do you like? Why? Are there things that you do not like? Why? What ideas are you going to include in your book? Why?
